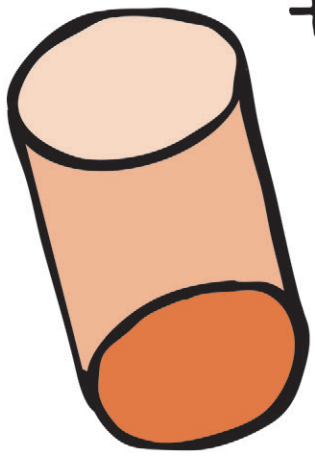


things to remember when...

Completing a diagnostic



+ The diagnostic works out what **maths you already know**, and what **maths you don't know yet**.

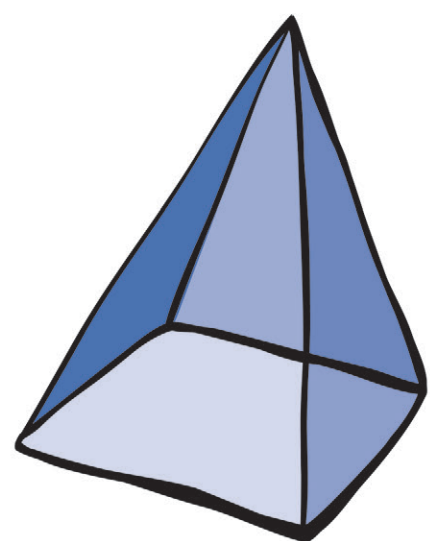
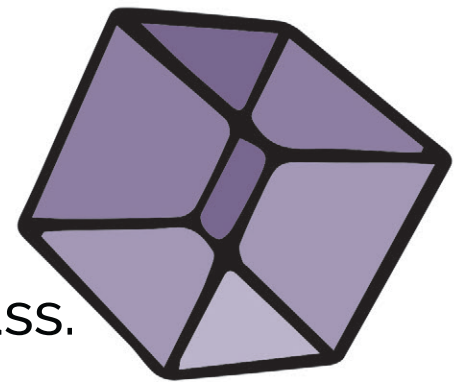
+ This lets us work out **what you're ready to learn next**.

+ Have **pen and paper** with you to help answer questions.

+ You might see a **question you don't know** how to answer. When this happens, just **use the "Skip" button**.

+ Do your **best to avoid mistakes**. If you make two mistakes in similar questions close together, **the computer will think** you **don't know that piece of maths yet**.

+ It is **normal** to have a **smaller or larger number** of questions on your diagnostic than others in the class.



+ A **progress bar** shows you how much information the computer has **gathered so far**.

+ Your diagnostic is **saved automatically**. If you need to log out, you can **pick up where you left off** later.
