
## things to remember when...

## Completing a diagnostic

- +
- + The diagnostic works out what maths you already know, and what maths you don't know yet.
  - + This lets us work out what you're ready to learn next.
  - + Have pen and paper with you to help answer questions.
- + You might see a question you don't know how to answer. When this happens, just use the "Skip" button.
- + Do your best to avoid mistakes. If you make two mistakes in similar questions close together, the computer will think you don't know that piece of maths yet.
- + It is normal to have a smaller or larger number of questions on your diagnostic than others in the class.



- + A progress bar shows you how much information the computer has gathered so far.
- + Your diagnostic is saved automatically. If you need to log out, you can pick up where you left off later.
